RULES & REGULATIONS

- (1) Dogs entered at Kennel Club licensed agility shows must be registered at the Kennel Club in accordance with the Kennel Club Regulations for Classification and Registration B, or else registration or transfer of registration must have been applied for. The registration number/authority to compete number will be required for each entry.
- (2) Entry fees: £2.70 per dog per class; Pairs £5.40; (helping Pads members £1.00 per dog per class, Pairs £2.00). Camping fees: £7 per night for Fri, Sat, Sun. Mon & Tues, or £30 if staying all 5 nights. Camping available: Friday 1st June 2012 (after 3pm or by prior agreement) the site must be vacated by 11am on Tuesday 5h June 2012 unless staying on for TAG show. Cheques will be cashed on receipt.
- (3) No prize money is on offer.
- (4) The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.
- (5) Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the first day of the show are not eligible to compete at Kennel Club licensed Agility Shows.
- (6) Not for competition entries will be accepted for dogs aged four calendar months and over. Dogs must be Kennel Club registered with their details recorded on the entry form.
- (7) No bitch in season is allowed to compete.
- (8) No person shall carry out punitive correction or harsh handling of a dog at any time within the boundaries of the show.
- (9) Dogs must not wear any type of slip, half slip collar or lead when under test. A flat, close fitting leather or webbing collar is permitted providing the only attachment is a plain identification panel as an integral part of the collar, i.e. not attached by a ring.
- (10) Should a judge be unable to fulfil the appointment to judge, the Committee reserves the right to appoint another judge.
- (11) No competitor shall impugn the decision of the judge or judges.
- (12) Thank you to our sponsors – Adams Agility, Jenny & Blair Willis, Alpha Foods, Staffordshire Organic Cheese, Karen Miaskowski & Touch Agility Group and Red Foot Processing.
- (13) Kennel Club standard marking regulations apply.
- (14) The height of hurdles for Veteran classes will be 45cm for large dogs, 35cm for medium dogs and between 5-7 inches for small dogs. The height of hurdles for Any Size classes will be 35cm for large dogs, 25cm for medium dogs and between 5-7 inches for small dogs. A dog may run over whichever height is suitable.
- (15) Large dogs – those measuring over 430mm (1ft 5ins) at the withers, medium dogs – those measuring over 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) but under 430mm (1ft 5 ins) at the withers and small dogs – those measuring 350mm (1ft 1.75ins) or less at the withers.
- (16) Judges at an agility show may not enter for competition a dog which is recorded in their ownership or part ownership; or handle a dog at the show at which they are judging. Dogs will be disqualified if proved to have been handled by the scheduled judge's spouse or immediate family, or resident at the same address as the scheduled judge.
- (17) Withdrawal of dogs from the test. A dog shall be withdrawn from competition and removed from the test if it is:
 - a bitch in season
 - suffering from any infectious or contagious diseases
 - interfering with the safety or chance of winning of an opponent
 - of such temperament or is no much out of hand as to be a danger to the safety of any person or animal
 - likely to cause suffering to the dog if it continues competing
- (18) In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including 25 days before the START of the competition (**8th May 2012**) shall be counted when entering any class. For these purposes a competition shall be defined as all classes covered within the same schedule. In the event that a dog becomes eligible for the next grade at a particular show, after the entry for that show has been sent, it is the competitor's responsibility to notify the show secretary at least 14 days before the date of the show. The dog will then be moved into the appropriate class(es) for the next grade. The dog must be moved into the corresponding classes as were entered at the lower grade. If there are fewer or no classes available for the next grade the competitor should be offered a refund of the relevant entry fees.
- (19) Should circumstances so dictate the Society, in consultation with the Judges may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to the Kennel Club.
- (20) Animals in Event - No animal other than one officially entered shall be brought into the precincts of the event during its continuance, except any dogs registered to assist the disabled, or dogs required for educational or instructional purposes or by permission of the General Committee. However, at the discretion of the show society, a dog brought to the show by a spectator may be admitted into the precincts of the dog show, with the proviso that those in charge of the dog sign a declaration confirming the dog is free from disease and that the dog will be kept under proper control at all times.
- (21) All dogs registered and resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show/event can be made. All overseas entries without a kennel club registration number or an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the competitor.
- (22) Competition of Dogs Suffering from Contagious Disease - No dogs suffering from infectious or contagious disease or having been exposed to such disease during the period 21 days prior to the competition may compete. Competitors infringing the regulation will be liable to be fined and/or dealt with under Kennel Club rule A42.
- (23) Should the judge deem a re-run is required, any result and/or faults gained in the previous run must be discounted.
- (24) A pay on the day class will be held if time permits.
- (25) A practice ring may be available to dogs entered for competition at the show, if space allows. This ring must be supervised by a responsible adult with agility knowledge.
- (26) Food shall not be carried in the hand or given to a dog in the ring.
- (27) It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Competitors must run as close to their running order as possible. Failure to do so may be reported to the Kennel club.
- (28) Separate entry forms must be completed by each owner and must be signed by the owner or his authorised agent in accordance with the provisions specified thereon and the dog's registration number must be included to be eligible to take part in the show. Entries will only be accepted on Pads Agility official entry forms (or photocopies) and must be accompanied with the appropriate fees. Incomplete entry forms and post dated cheques are not accepted and will be returned. All referred cheques will be charged £10.00.
- (29) All dogs are entered at their owner's risk, whilst every care will be taken, the Club will not accept responsibility for the loss, damage or injury to persons, dogs or property however caused whilst at the show.
- (30) Dogs entered in breach of Kennel Club regulations are liable to disqualification whether or not the owner was aware of the breach.
- (31) In the event that the show is cancelled due to unforeseen circumstances, Pads Agility will refund fees, less reasonably incurred expenses, on a receipt of a stamped addressed envelope submitted within 1 month of the show date.
- (32) **Welfare of Dogs** – An exhibitor (or competitor) whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licensed event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met, and should not knowingly put their dogs health and welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. A breach of this Regulation may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
- (33) Overpaid entries will not be refunded.
- (34) Competitors must follow the instructions of stewards with respect to parking, camping & conduct with the show boundaries.
- (35) Goods may not be sold within the precincts of the showground without prior permission of the committee.
- (36) All caravans / camping units must carry suitable fire extinguishers and facilities for fire fighting. Campers must remain within their allotted space and must not obstruct the roadways.
- (37) Dogs entered in veteran / any size classes may not be entered in any other classes.
- (38) Competitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dogs, if you fail to clean up after your dog, you will be asked to leave the venue.
- (39) No refunds after closing date.
- (40) Under no circumstances will practice equipment be permitted anywhere on the showground.

ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASSES

Large Dogs	For those dogs measuring over 43 cm at the withers, jump height will be set at 65cm.
Medium Dogs	For those dogs measuring over 35cm or under 43cm at the withers, jump height will be set at 45cm.
Small Dogs	For those dogs measuring 35cm or less at the withers, jump height will be set at 35cm.

In the following definitions of classes first prizes or other prize wins are those gained in standard classes at any Kennel Club licensed Open Agility Shows (i.e. limited agility shows, special classes and invitation events excepted). Only a first place with a clear round within course time will count towards grade progression. Agility classes to include contact points & jumping classes where there are no contact obstacles. With this proviso classes are defined as follows:

Class Structure. A Class may either be held as a Graded Class or a Combined Class. A Graded Class may be scheduled for one or more consecutive Grades with separate results and awards issued for each grade. A Combined Class may be scheduled for more than one consecutive grade with one overall set of results.

Progression. Progression from each Grade will require one Agility win or three Jumping wins at that grade, except that progression from Grade 6 will require 4 wins at Grade 6, two of which must be agility classes. Results from Combined Classes will only count towards progression from the dog's current grade.

Points Progression. At the handler's discretion a dog may progress up to Grade 5 by winning 75 points at each grade, using the Agility Warrant points scheme, Regulation K3.c refers, except that there is no requirement for a minimum number of agility points. If this method of progression is selected, the handler must ensure the Show Secretary signs the dog's Agility Record Book at the first show entered at the higher grade. There is no time limit on this progression, however, once a dog has progressed, it cannot return to a previous grade.

Standard Classes. Only first prizes and points gained in standard classes at Kennel Club Licensed Agility Shows may be used for progression through the classes. (A dog is only eligible for one grade). In defining the eligibility of the owner or handler for Grade 1, the three jumping wins and points progression referred to in the definition apply only to one dog and not an accumulation of dogs.

Grade 1 (Elementary)	For owners, handlers or dogs which have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Kennel Club licensed agility shows. (N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 1 (Elementary) are not eligible for this class).
Grade 2 (Starters)	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grades 1,3,4,5,6,7 and have not gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows or elected to progress on points from Grade 1. (N.B. Owners, handlers or dogs previously qualified out of Grade 2 (Starters) are not eligible for this class).
Grade 3 (Graduate)	Open to dogs which are not eligible for Grade 1 or 2 or have elected to progress on points from Grade 2 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows and dogs which are not eligible for Grade 4, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 4 (Novice)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 3 or elected to progress on points from Grade 3 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 5, 6 or 7.
Grade 5 (Intermediate)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 4 or elected to progress on points from Grade 4 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 6 or 7.
Grade 6 (Senior)	Open to dogs which have gained a first place in an Agility Class or three first places in Jumping Classes at Grade 5 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows and are not eligible for Grade 3, 4, 5 or 7.
Grade 7 (Advanced)	Open to dogs which have gained a minimum of four first places at Grade 6 at Kennel Club licensed agility shows, two first places must be gained in agility (not jumping) classes.
Special Any Size Jumping	Open to all sizes of dogs not entered in any other class this weekend (Special Veteran Jumping Excepted). Jump Heights: Large 35cm, Medium 25cm, Small between 5-7 inches or at the judge's discretion (No weaves or tyre). A dog may run at whichever height suits. (See Below)
Special Veteran Jumping	Open to any size dog aged 9 years and over not entered in any other class this weekend (Special Any Size Jumping Excepted). Jump Heights: Large 45cm, Medium 35cm, Small between 5-7 inches or at the judge's discretion (No weaves or tyre). A dog may run at whichever height suits. (See Below)
Special Junior Agility & Jumping U12	This class is open to all Large, Medium and Small dogs, Grades 1 – 7. Handlers must be under 12 years of age on the day of the show to compete.
Special Junior Agility & Jumping O12	This class is open to all Large, Medium and Small dogs, Grades 1 – 7. Handlers must be over 12 years of age (and under 18 years) on the day of the show to compete.

Special Anysize Jumping & Veteran Jumping

The Anysize Jumping and Veteran Jumping classes are special "fun" classes, you may run your dogs over whichever height he/she is comfortable with. If you have a large dog (even if jumping small or micro height) please enter the class for Large dogs.

Special Small & Medium Pairs Classes

Class 24 – Open to medium dogs, to be run over a standard jumping course. There will be a baton change between the first and second handler which must take place behind a line, failure to do so will incur 100 faults. If a dog is eliminated, it will incur 100 faults.

Class 33 – Open to small dogs, to be run over a standard jumping course. There will be a baton change between the first and second handler which must take place behind a line, failure to do so will incur 100 faults. If a dog is eliminated, it will incur 100 faults.

2012 Rules of Competition

- 1 This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club Rules in force at the time of the competition.
- 2 All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
- 3 The competition is open to Kennel Club registered dogs eligible to compete at large height grades 3, 4 & 5 only
- 4 Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
- 5 Once a dog has qualified for the final it may not enter any further heats except as a not for competition entry. Handlers running not for competition with a previously qualified dog must report the fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class.
- 6 The first four dogs from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.
- 7 The next four dogs from each heat will be held as reserves.
- 8 In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up in numerical order.
- 9 In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog.
- 10 The first section of the competition will contain the following pieces of equipment: A frame, Dogwalk, Seesaw, a rising spread jump and a long jump. The placement of these obstacles is at the judge's discretion.
- 11 The first section is un-timed and dogs must successfully complete this section without faults before proceeding to the second section of the competition. Dogs with faults will not be allowed to proceed to the second section.
- 12 The second section is timed and will contain no more than fourteen but no less than twelve single pole hurdles plus a set of twelve weaves. The placement of these obstacles is at the judge's discretion.
- 13 Handlers are not allowed to touch their dogs between the separate elements of the first section but may touch their dogs between the first and second sections of the competition.
- 14 The object of the competition is to complete the control section of the class successfully before competing, against the clock, on a jumping course. The winner and subsequent places will be decided on the fastest time with the least faults over the second section of the course.

2012 Rules of Competition

1. This class must be judged under the appropriate Kennel Club rules in force at the time of the competition.
2. All competitors entering the class will be deemed to have agreed to abide by the rules of the Kennel Club and the specific regulations governing this class.
3. The competition is open to Medium and Small Kennel Club registered dogs Grades 1 – 7.
4. Handlers may enter more than one dog in the competition and may qualify more than one dog for the final event.
5. Once a dog has qualified for the final it may not enter any further heats except as a not for competition entry. Handlers running not for competition with a previously qualified dog must report the fact to the appropriate Show Secretary before running in the class.
6. The first 2 dogs from each heat will be invited to compete in the final.
7. The next 2 dogs will be held as reserves.
8. In the event of a dog being unable to compete in the final due to unavailability, illness or injury the reserves from that heat will be called up on numerical order.
9. In the event of a handler being unable to compete in a heat due to illness or injury a substitute handler for the qualifying dog will be allowed to run the dog.
10. The first section of the competition must contain 12 jumps set at 450mm for Medium dogs and 350mm for Small dogs plus no more than 2 rigid tunnels. The placement of these obstacles to be at the judge's discretion.
11. The first section is timed and dogs must successfully complete this section without faults before proceeding to the second section of the competition. Dogs with faults will not be allowed to proceed to the second section.
12. The second section of the competition will contain the following pieces of equipment: A Frame, Dog walk, Seesaw, a long jump set at 2' 6" for Medium dogs & 1' 6" for Small dogs, 12 weaves. The placement of these obstacles is at the judge's discretion.
13. The second section of the competition is un-timed.
14. Handlers are allowed to touch their dogs between the first and second section but may not touch their dogs between the obstacles in the second section.
15. The object of the competition is to complete the jumping section with no faults, against the clock, before going on to complete the control section. The winner and subsequent places will be decided on the fastest time and no faults on the control section.
16. There will be no tyre or spread.

The Laser Knockout Pairs

The Laser knockout pairs is a fun competition, sponsored by Blair and Jenny Willis in memory of Laser (Fels Magic Laser), who really loved competing in the knockout pairs competitions.

- 1 The class will be open only to all large dogs.
- 2 There will be eight qualifying heats. The top four pairs from each heat will qualify for the Final, which will take place at TAG Summer Show in 2012. Once a pair has qualified for the final, they may not run in further heats for the final which they have qualified for.
- 3 Handlers may enter more than one pair. Dogs may only compete in one pair in any heat. If a handler has entered more than one pair and is drawn to run against themselves, they may nominate another handler to run one of the dogs that handler must then continue to run the dog for the rest of the heat and if they qualify for the final, they must run the dog in the final. Alternatively the handler can nominate which pair should continue in the heat.
- 4 The pairs will compete against each other over two similar courses. There will be a judge for each course. There will be a baton change between the first and second handler which must take place behind a line, failure to do so will incur 100 faults. Time and faults will be added together and the winning pair will be the one with the lowest time. The judges' decision will be final.
- 5 The course will consist of 10 obstacles, made up of jumps, tunnels and weaves (6 poles) only. Normal marking will apply. If a dog is eliminated, it will incur 100 faults. Should both pairs be eliminated, the pair which was eliminated first will lose.
- 6 The winning pairs from each round will go through to the next round until there is only one pair remaining.
- 7 Pairs will be issued with a running order which must be strictly adhered to. Pairs failing to run when due will be knocked out and the other pair will go through to the next round.
- 8 Only handlers and dogs originally entered may compete at the final (except in the case of rule 3). Any changes are at the organisers' discretion.

The winners and runners up for each heat will receive a trophy and rosettes will be presented to the last 8 pairs.



The food of champions The Alpha Agility Challenge 2012

The Alpha Agility Challenge is an agility competition for large dogs eligible for Grades 1, 2 and 3 held using Kennel Club Rules & Regulations.

9 qualifying heats producing 45 finalists who will compete at The Alpha Agility Challenge Grand Final to be held on Sunday 30th September 2012 at The Malvern Autumn Show, Three Counties Showground, Malvern, WR13 6NW.

Once a dog has qualified (i.e. 5 finalists per heat) this eliminates the dog from taking a further finalist place and the next highest placed dog in The Alpha Agility Challenge class will be invited to the final.

A judge has the option to award a Alpha Agility Challenge Wildcard. Once a dog has been awarded an Alpha Agility Challenge Wildcard this eliminates the dog from further wildcard or qualifying place for The Alpha Agility Challenge 2012. All Wildcard nominees will be invited to the final.

Handlers may not qualify more than one dog for The Alpha Agility Challenge Final.

Any surrogate handlers must be notified in writing within 4 days of the last heat. No amendments after this date and non-advice will disqualify the partnership.

TAG Brace Qualifier

Open to all dogs entered in the show including Veteran dogs & pairs can contain differing heights of dogs as the height of hurdles will be 350mm for ALL dogs. One handler will run two dogs separately over a course of jumps (a minimum of 14 & a maximum of 18 obstacles will be used). The course can include a rigid tunnel and will not contain weaves, a tyre, long jump or flat tunnel. The course should be a fast flowing course which is fun & a blast for handler & dog alike.

The handler & two dogs will start in a box. A groom maybe used to hold the dog that is not running but must not leave the box until both runs are completed. If both dogs are on the course at the same time then elimination will occur and the 2nd dog needs to be back in the box before the handler continues with the course (if any incorrect obstacles are taken by the current dog whilst the 2nd is being returned to the box then any appropriate penalties will be given). For each elimination a 50 point penalty will be given & judging will continue. The top 3 pairs will go through to the Final at Easter. Trophies for 1st & 2nd Place and rosettes to 4th.

DOGS IN CARS ON HOT DAYS

Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the Kennel Club offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and don'ts travelling to and whilst at KC licensed events.

- ◆ When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams.
- ◆ If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all.
- ◆ The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken, with lots of water available to drink.
- ◆ Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog.
- ◆ When at the show, never leave your dog in the vehicle.
- ◆ Keep the dog in the shade – take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog always stays well hydrated.
- ◆ Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion, or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time.

Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare.

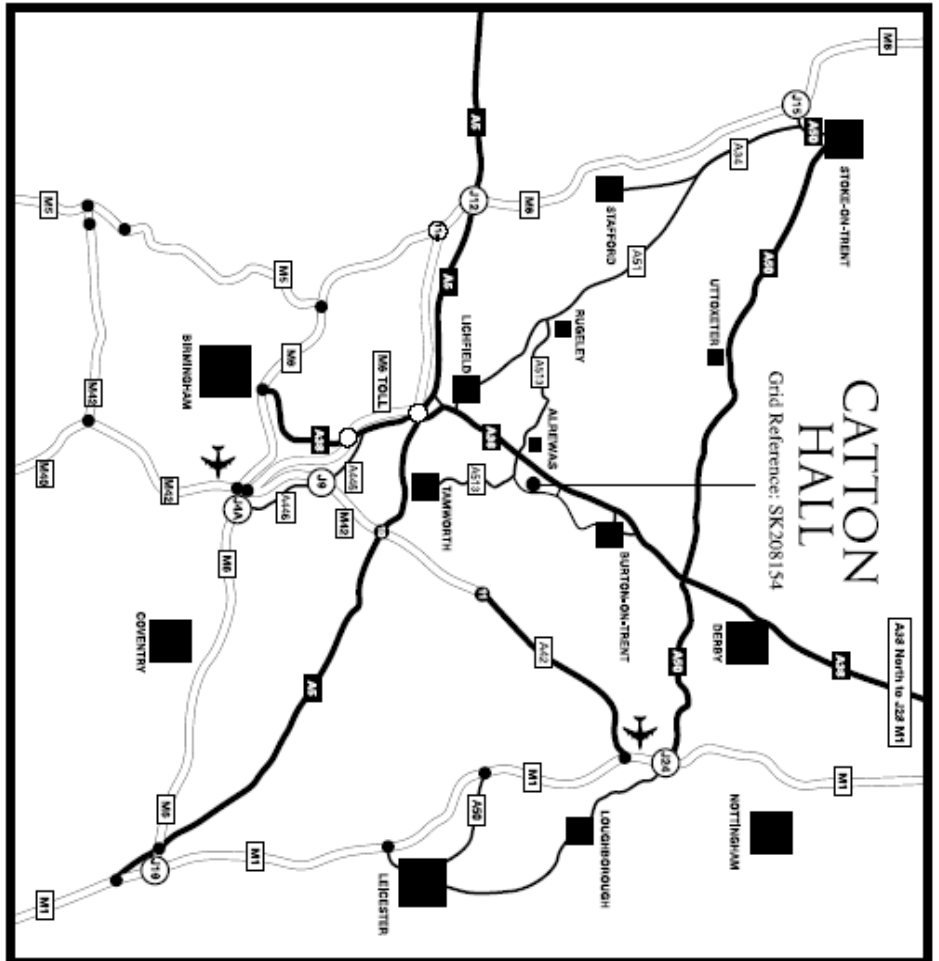
DIRECTIONS TO CATTON HALL: PLEASE READ LOCAL DIRECTIONS

All vehicles must leave the A38 at the Alrewas Junction and take the A513 towards Tamworth, do not follow SATNAV. DO NOT approach through Walton-on-Trent/Barton-under-Needwood as there is a very narrow bridge and is just passable with a small car, NOT SUITABLE FOR CARAVANS OR MOTORHOMES AND THERE ARE NO TURNING POINTS.

Leave the A38 at the Alrewas Junction and take the A513 towards Tamworth. Follow this road for approx 1 mile to the railway bridge. Turn left immediately after the railway bridge and follow this road for approx 2 miles and Catton Hall is on the left hand side shortly after the Lodge House and the "South Derbyshire" sign.
